## TRIP TIME

Trip departs 1 hour before sunset, and operates out of our sister property, the Evergreen Lodge. Check with the Recreation Desk for current trip time.

\$65 person 21 and over; \$40 person 20 and under. Includes naturalist guide, chairs, beverages, and snacks.

Meet at the Evergreen Lodge Recreation Center 15 minutes before departure. Please allow for 15-20 minute driving time.

- Camera and binoculars
